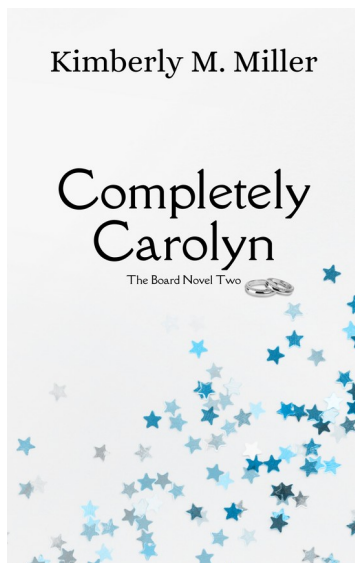




Completely Carolyn

Book Group Questions

Thank you for choosing *Completely Carolyn* for your book group. I hope you enjoyed reading Carolyn and Atlas's story and that these questions serve to bring further discussion to your book group experience.

1. Did you read 'Time for Julie' before reading 'Completely Carolyn'? How did this add to your experience with this new story? Did Carolyn and Atlas meet, exceed, or fall short of your expectations? How so?
2. What did you think about the women of The Board? What wisdom did you take from them in the latest installment of their story? Did anything surprise you this time around?
3. If there were other books in The Board series (and there will be!)- which member of The Board would you most like to read about? What do you think her story and subsequent romance will be like? What issues or hang-ups will hold her back or help her?

4. Did you relate to Atlas's reservations and fears? In what way? Or to Carolyn's? Did Carolyn's experience with Knox stand out to you- how so? How does a break up or previous negative experience challenge a person as s/he tries to move on? Did Carolyn handle healing well? How did Atlas help/ hinder this?
5. What aspect of the book, characters, or story did you find to be challenging?
6. Did this remind you of another book or author? Who/ which book(s)/ why?
7. Who were your favorite characters? Why?
8. What characters did you dislike? Were there any characters that you didn't relate to? Why?
9. What are your hopes for Carolyn and Atlas in the future? What do you predict their relationship will look like?
10. Which character from the book would you like to meet the most and why? What would you like to ask or tell them?
11. What about Atlas and Carolyn (or their relationship) did you find to be relatable? Most romantic? Was there anything about them that you didn't relate to or found frustrating?
12. What feelings did this book evoke for you? Why/ how was this accomplished?
13. What was your favorite quote or passage, and why did it stand out to you?
14. If this book were made into a movie, who would you cast? What changes would

you want to see happen to work more effectively for film?

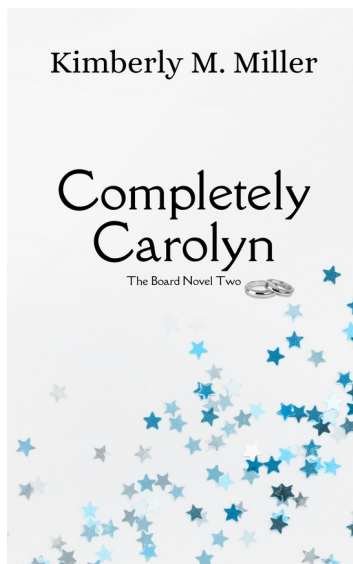
15. Does this book remind you of any songs, artist, or other media? If so, which ones/ who and why?
