

## Evelyn's Game



- 1. For the person who chose this book for the group- What led you to select this story? What stood out to you (blurb, cover design, positive experience with other books by Kimberly M. Miller)?
- 2. What did you think about Gabe's friends tricking him into dating? How did you feel about Gabe's reluctance to be in relationships? Why did you initially think he protested dating?
- 3. What did you like about Evelyn? What frustrated you about her?
- 4. What did you like about Gabe? What frustrated you about him?
- 5. What aspect of the book, characters, or story did you find to be challenging?
- 6. Did this remind you of another book or author? Who/ which book(s)/ why?

- 7. Who were your favorite characters? Why?
- 8. What characters did you dislike? Were there any characters that you didn't relate to? Why?
- 9. What do you predict for Gabe and his father in the future? Will their relationship continue to improve? What about for Evelyn and her mom? Will they find reconciliation and healing? If so, how?
- 10. What did you think about the 'Broken Hearts Club'? Should Gabe have addressed them directly at any point in the story or was their disconnect (and admiration from afar) more intriguing?
- 11. Which character from the book would you like to meet the most and why? What would you like to ask or tell them?
- 12. What about Evelyn and Gabe (or their relationship) did you find to be relatable? Most romantic? Was there anything about them that you didn't relate to or found frustrating?
- 13. What feelings did this book evoke for you? Why/ how was this accomplished?
- 14. What was your favorite quote or passage, and why did it stand out to you?
- 15. What was the most romantic moment in the story?
- 16. If this book were made into a movie, who would you cast? What changes would you want to see happen to work more effectively for film?

- 17. Does this book remind you of any songs, artist, or other media? If so, which ones/ who and why?
- 18. Did you think the characters and their problems/decisions/relationships were believable or realistic? If not, why?
- 19. Did you find any of the characters' decisions to be frustrating? Why?
- 20. Did you learn anything new, maybe about yourself or a societal issue that is prevalent today?
