Thank you for choosing 'Lucy in Love' for your book group.

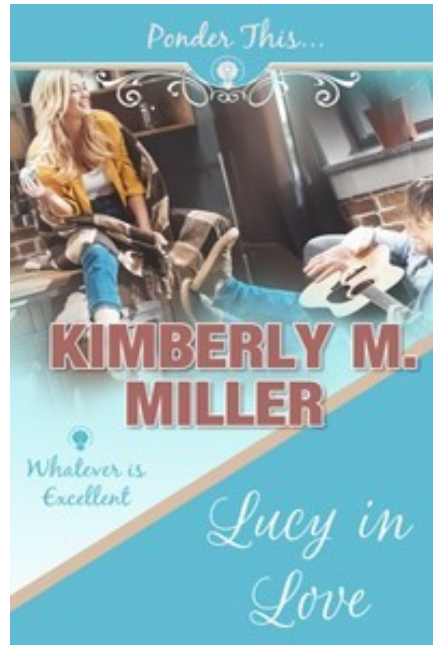
I hope you enjoyed reading Henry and Lucy's story and that these questions serve to bring further discussion to your book group experience.

3. What frustrated you most about their relationship?
4. What actor or musician might you cast as Henry? Why?
5. What actor (or otherwise) would you cast as Lucy? Why?
6. What surprised you most between the characters?
7. Who were your favorite side characters? Why? Who would you cast in those roles?
8. What kind of music do you think inspired Henry? Why?
9. What kinds of emotions did the story elicit for you? Why? What scenes specifically stood out to do this for you?
10. What do you think happens after the story ends?

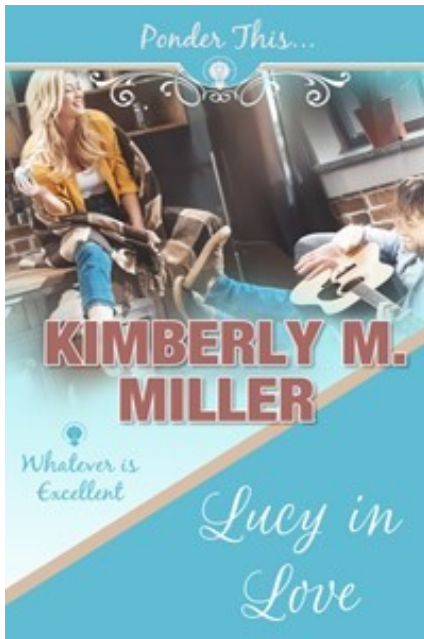
### Lucy in Love (general questions)

10. What feelings did this book evoke for you?
11. What songs does this book make you think of? Create a book group playlist together!
12. If you got the chance to ask the author of this book one question, what would it be?
13. Which character in the book would you most like to meet?
14. What do you think of the book's title? How does it relate to the book's contents? What other title might you choose?
